<u>CPRsouth Conference</u>, January 19-21, 2007 <u>Call for Applications for Young Scholar Awards</u>

LIRNEasia is seeking applications for 15 awards to be made to young scholars attending the inaugural conference of CPRsouth. Each award comprises of (a) free registration for a two-day pre-conference tutorial on ICT policy and regulation research in the Asia Pacific, to be held on January 17-18, 2007, (b) cost of travel to and from Manila, and (c) accommodation and meals at the conference venue for five nights. All incidental costs will have to borne by the participants.

LIRNEasia is a regional information and communication technology (ICT) policy and regulation research and capacity building organization. Communication Policy Research—South (CPRsouth), a new initiative by LIRNEasia and the International Development Research Centre of Canada (IDRC), intends to build Asian-based human capacity by reinforcing and developing the values and commitment of existing scholars in and with interest in the emerging Asia-Pacific. The overall objective is to create policy intellectuals capable of informed and effective intervention in ICT policy and regulatory processes in specific country contexts.

Please email your applications by or before October 15, 2006 to info@cprsouth.org. The application should consist of (a) a one-page bio that includes your contact information and the name and contact information for current supervisor or mentor, and (b) a one-page write-up outlining why you wish to be an Asia-based expert capable of contributing to ICT policy and regulatory reform in the region. Please name the file CPRsouth_YoungScholar_YourLastName.

We may contact your supervisor or mentor before making the final selections. You will be notified of acceptance by November 15, 2006 with instructions on travel arrangements. The agenda for the conference is appended.
